




LIFE-IP CEI-Greece during the pandemic

The project LIFE-IP CEI-Greece "Circular Economy Implementation in Greece" launched during the COVID-19 pandemic, facing from its very early days unprecedented daily conditions and continuous challenges.

The project is evolving according to plan, utilizing the new communication opportunities offered by digital technologies and carefully dealing with all rising needs through the fruitful collaboration between partners.

The 2nd Newsletter is an overview of the progress of LIFE-IP CEI-Greece so far, including recent news and activities.







REVIEW OF THE NWMP 2015-2020

Given that the objectives of action A1.1, as described in the initial proposal of the project, were covered by the revision of the National Waste Management Plan (NWMP) 2015-2020, the Central Coordination Board of LIFE-IP CEI-Greece approved a proposal initiated by the MEEN to update the action as follows:

- Authoring a Special Programme for Food Waste Prevention, an obligation of the country according to the Directive for Waste, modified with the Directive 2018/851/EU, being implemented by the foreseen measure (A Σ A 8) in the National Plan for the Reduction of Food Waste of the new NWMP.
- Recording of the waste recovery units at national level utilizing data from the national registers and other sources of information. This recording is a complementary action to the NWMP 2015-2020 update and supports the implementation of the foreseen measure (A Σ A10) "Upgrading the quality and reliability of the qualitative and quantitative data with regard to waste management".



In the context of this action a national survey on circular economy was completed, addressed to all stakeholders that could contribute to the transition of the country towards the circular economy.






National survey for circular economy

The conducting of this research was based on the mapping of public entities and all stakeholders directly involved in waste management, as well as bodies of the production/supply chain and the social and economic cycle in general. The research was conducted nationally, with the following objectives:

- Understanding the needs for information and training of all stakeholders involved in circular economy matters in their field of expertise,
- The prevailing perception of stakeholders with regard to priority products, challenges and overall priorities, means of promotion and sectors with growth potential for the implementation of circular economy,
- Their views on specific subjects of interest of LIFE-IP CEI-Greece, such as the implementation of the new legal framework of the European Union for Waste and the formulation of standards/technical specifications for secondary materials.





The circular economy survey took place through a suitably designed e-questionnaire addressing all stakeholders that could potentially contribute towards the implementation of circular economy in Greece (public administration, waste management bodies, producers, social & economic entities, research and academic community), including sections of questions with special topics, targeted to specific categories of bodies/entities.

The survey results will be utilized when designing the capacity building actions, that will be implemented in the context of Action C7, throughout the duration of the project.

Data collection for waste from the agro-food sector at national regional & local level has been completed with regard to the project pilot areas: the islands of Tinos, Thira, Paros and Antiparos and the municipality of Nafpaktos.

The collection of data came as a result of the following actions:

- On site investigation in the pilot areas
- Interviews with public institutions and services
- Data recovery from the Electronic Waste Register
- Data research in available studies and deliverables of other projects

Collection of information on agro-food waste management best practices and innovative R&D results A3 M2

At the same time a number of best practice examples for agro-food waste management emerged, from the bibliography, traditional local practices and innovative projects in Greece and Europe, that can trigger content for the relevant Guide that will be prepared shortly by the LIFE-IP CEI-Greece team.



Milestone C4 M1, Detailed determination / adaptation of the appropriate methodology for the assessment of food waste generation for each sector, based on the relevant EU methodology (expected, as to Directive

The report C4.M1(milestone C4.M1) was recently completed by the Harokopian University of Athens. It comprises a thorough guide, in line with the established legal framework and the EU strategy, addressed to all stakeholders interested in the quantification of food waste in all stages of the food supply chain, from production, processing, transportation, trade and finally consumption (catering, hospitality and households). The report includes references to the most accepted methodological approaches at international level, their selection criteria and their advantages and limitations.

The ultimate goal is the compilation of reliable and comparable data for the generation of food waste and food losses.

Creation of an Experiential Park (RRR *) in Thessaloniki

Action E1.3



The Ecological Recycling Society recently completed the deliverable E1.D4 "Report describing the detailed design of the Recycling-Reuse-Repair (RRR) Experiential Park"

Through the RRR the cultivation of environmental awareness is sought on the one hand, for targeted groups, primarily the student population in the Municipality of Thessaloniki at school level (primary target group), and on the other hand, the dissemination of the project results to the general public. Bearing in mind that the RRR is addressed primarily to children, its main activities will combine the dissemination of theoretical knowledge for contemporary environmental issues; putting emphasis upon the management of municipal solid waste, with experiential learning activities, through which, school age children in Thessaloniki will have the opportunity to understand in real time and in practice, a number of ways to transform waste into secondary and recycled raw materials, for the production of new objects.






Conference Programme

Some characteristics of the impact of the inaugural conference are:

- 1. The number of people that filled in the evaluation questionnaire (graph 1).
- 2. The high level of satisfaction from the content of the presentations and the following dialogue
- 3. The practical benefit for the attendees, bearing in mind that the Conference improved their knowledge on Circular Economy (graph 2).

The answers regarding the quality of the presentations and the understanding of the expressed views were also very positive.

Finally in an open ended question for the submission of proposals for future conferences 50 answers were submitted including: more interaction with the audience, broadening of the speakers i.e. with active workers of the sector, involvement of other Ministries for a holistic approach to the transition towards CE, involvement of businesses active in CE, a detailed presentation of the legal framework, funding sources for CE, sustainable development, climate change, energy saving, electro-mobility etc.
