


direct access to political hierarchies and decision makers

Our work with islands - 1



BLUEISLANDS NANUTSHELL

- → 14 partners from 8 countries (CY, GR, IT, ES, MT, HR, BE, FR) 9 islands
- → systematic effort to properly **identify**, **address** and **mitigate** the effects of the **seasonal variation of waste generation on MED islands**



Monitoring phase (plastic pollution, wastewater, waste characterization study)




Testing phase (design, development and monitoring of pilot actions)

Our work with islands - 2





Co-funded by the COSME programme of the European Union

Transnational schemes supporting tourism SMEs and based on capacity building, knowledge transfer and scaling-up of activities for sustainable growth. 3 core supporting activities, based on the specific needs of each SME:

- Face-to-face and online capacity building trainings and mentoring on energy efficiency, resources consumption, circular solutions, waste management, eco-design, green procurement, mobility or social innovation;
- Matchmaking SMEs to create synergies business-to-business (B2B) which will facilitate the exchange of good practices among SMEs and technology and sustainable solutions providers;
- Facilitating access to environmental certifications, in particular promoting environmental certifications and other EC initiatives, such as EMAS, EU eco-label, ETIS or EDEN.

Coordination of regional and local policies

- ➤ Compulsory separate collection of biowaste, including staged capture rates targets, aiming at collecting, at least 105 kg of biowaste per inhabitant by 2018.
- An increase of the landfill tax from the minimum set up in Italian law back then (10€/t) to the maximum (25.8€/t).
- The introduction of a **bonus/malus system on the cost of residual waste** management, to reward or penalize municipalities on the basis of their performance.
- ➤ The promotion of door-to-door as the preferred model for separate collection of waste, along with pay-asyou-throw schemes and home composting
- ► A comprehensive regional strategic public procurement plan

From 2003 to 2016: Separate collection rates increase from 3.4% to 60.15% Residual waste decreased from 500 kg to 176 kg per inhabitant










Porquerolles - MED-3R actions

technical solutions tested at pilot level:

- * 28 pre-diagnosis among restaurateurs on type and rates of generated waste
- * test of thermal waste composter, and solar waste compactors for non-recyclable waste on the island

Krk - tourist & community engagement

Households and hotels

- * Provide necessary bins for the rented accomodations
- * Introduce the waste collection system to tourists
- * Take care about separate waste collection timetable

Tourism, waste and circularity - looking ahead

Greater consensus towards 'ecological transition' measures, linking citizens engagement and support to help SMEs reach sustainability targets/performance Need of:

- → More targeted and agile policies, providing the right incentives to promote sustainability
- → Integrated policy/industry/community approach
- → Are local approaches providing the right key?
- \rightarrow How EU enabling frameworks (WFD, Farm to fork, ...) can support circular economy islands
